Principles of Adult Learners

Adult Learners usually approach learning differently than younger learners.

- They are more self-guided in their learning.
- They bring more, and expect to bring more, to a learning situation because of their wider experience- and can take away more.
- They require learning to "make sense" they will not perform a learning activity just because they are told to.

Adult learner Characteristics

- Adults have years of experience and a wealth of knowledge
- Adults have established values, beliefs, and opinions.
- Adults expect to be treated as adults.
- Adults need to be self-directed.
- Adults have increased variation in learning styles.

- Reflective Thinkers
- Creative Thinkers
- Practical Thinkers
- Conceptual Thinkers

Learning Styles

- Visual Learners process new information best when it is visually illustrated or demonstrated.
- Auditory Learners process new information best when it is spoken.
- Kinesthetic Learners process new information best when it can be touched or manipulated.
- Environmental Learners process new information best when it is presented in surroundings that match learning preferences (room temperature, lighting, seating, etc.

Attributes of a Good Director - from The Perfect Blend - Dr. Timothy Seelig

Director/Singer Rapport – Our singers won't return if there is no connection and it is not fun.

Diagnosis & Prescription – Know how to diagnose problems and know how to fix them. Your chorus must be able to hear the difference when you diagnose a problem and when you fix it. They should also be able to feel the difference in how they produce what you are asking them to change.

Specificity of Language – if you can carefully communicate with your chorus what it is you want and be consistent with that, it will assist you in succeeding.

Efficient use of time – this is HUGE! You owe it to your chorus to NOT waste any of their time. Efficient use of rehearsal time is crucial.

Measurable results – what reflects success for you and your chorus? Competition scores? Number of local performances? Growth in membership? The joy of performing?
