Chord Symbol Labels

(options in parentheses and italics show how chords may be labeled in sheet music; when completing assignments, please label chords as shown in the examples)

Major Triad: Use a Capital Letter

• C Major Chord = C; F Major Chord = F; G Major Chord = G

Dominant (or Barbershop) 7th Chord: Use a Capital Letter plus a 7 (dom 7)

• C Dominant Chord = C7; F# Dominant Chord = F#7; Bb Dominant Chord = Bb7

Dominant (or Barbershop) 9th Chord: Use a Capital Letter plus a 9 (dom 9)

• C Dominant 9th Chord = C9; G Dominant 9th Chord = G 9; C# Dominant 9th Chord = C#9

Major 6th Chord: Use a Capital Letter plus a 6 (M6 or Maj6)

• C Major 6^{th} Chord = C6; Ab Major 6^{th} Chord = Ab6; D Major 6^{th} Chord = D6

Major 7th Chord: Use a Capital Letter, plus a Capital M, plus a 7 (M7 or Maj7)

• C Major 7th Chord = CM7; F Major 7th Chord = FM7; E Major 7th Chord = E M7

Major 9th Chord: Use a Capital Letter, plus a Capital M, plus a 9 (Maj9)

• C Major 9th Chord = CM9; G Major 9th Chord = GM9; D Major 9th Chord = D M9

Minor Triad: Use a Capital Letter plus a lower-case m (min or lower case of root name)

• C Minor Chord = Cm; G Minor Chord = Gm; A Minor Chord = A^{\flat} m

Minor 6th Chord: Use a Capital Letter, plus a lower-case m, plus a 6 (min6)

• C Minor 6th Chord = Cm6; F# Minor 6th Chord = F#m6; B Minor 6th Chord = B m6

Minor 7th Chord: Use a Capital Letter, plus a lower-case m, plus a 7 (min7)

• C Minor 7th Chord = Cm7; F Minor 7th Chord = Fm7; B Minor 7th Chord = Bm7

Augmented Triad: Use a Capital Letter plus a "+" sign or a Capital Letter plus "aug"

• C Augmented Chord = C⁺ or Caug; G Augmented Chord = G⁺ or Gaug

Diminished 7th Chord: Use all lower-case letters to write the abbreviation "dim"

- Any Diminished Chord = dim (No letter names are used like the other chords)
- (sheet music may show the root name plus a symbol, such as C°)
